

Who We Are

Our Identity:

Administration of the Church

Church Staff

The senior pastor is responsible for leading the church in accordance with the truth of God's word. The senior pastor is the leader of the church. Under the leadership of, and in accordance with the senior pastor, the paid ministerial and non-ministerial staff carry out day to day operations and ministries of the church.

Deacons

The deacon body consists of godly and approved men chosen by the church. The role of a deacon is a service role. Deacons serve the church and assist the pastoral staff to minister to the church body.

Church Committees

For administrative purposes, Southmont is organized by 5 standing committees to help accomplish the church's missions and tasks. Southmont is comprised of the following standing committees: Personnel, Finance, Missions, Property and Grounds, and Committee on Committees. Committee members are elected by the church and may serve on a committee for no longer than 3 consecutive years. (Exception: Committee on Committees)

- Committee Job Descriptions

1. Personnel Committee – oversight of paid personnel of the church.
2. Finance Committee – oversight of the church's finances and budget.
3. Missions Committee – oversight of the mission work of the church.
4. Property and Grounds – oversight of the church's property and building.
5. Committee on Committees – fill vacancies on the other four standing committees.

Advisory Council

The church's advisory council serves as the principal advisory group to the church and the senior pastor on planning issues. This council is comprised of the senior pastor, church officers (moderator, clerk, treasurer, and parliamentarian), chairman of the deacons, chairs of all standing committees, and three at-large-members.

Constitution and Bylaws

The Constitution and Bylaws govern the affairs of Southmont. The Church must conduct all business of the church in accordance with the church's constitution and bylaws. The church's constitution and bylaws may be found on the church's website.

About Southmont

Southmont Baptist Church is a multi-generational group of people who desire to grow in Christ and serve Him in our local community and around our globe. Missions, ministries, relationships, and fellowship all help to describe who we are and who we are becoming.

Sunday school classes for all ages, Biblical-based sermons, and inspirational worship and praise serve as a foundation for preparing us to serve Christ in an ever-changing world with a never changing message of hope. With each member following the example Christ set before us, we hope to be “a light to all generations.”

Southmont History

Southmont began in January of 1979 as a cooperative effort of First Baptist Church of Denton, the Denton Baptist Association, and the Baptist General Convention of Texas. The church first met in a rented storefront near the current site of McMath Middle School. Since then, Southmont has continued to grow and spread the word of Christ.

Affiliations of Southmont

Denton Baptist Association: Southmont Baptist is a member of the DBA. DBA is comprised of approximately 90 churches. DBA is a network of diverse, autonomous churches working together to plant new churches, equip and nurture one another, and engage in cooperative ministries for the purpose of fulfilling the Great Commission.

Baptist General Convention of Texas: Southmont Baptist is affiliated with the BGCT. Southmont contributes financially to the BGCT through the Cooperative Program as well as the Mary Hill Davis, Lottie Moon, and Annie Armstrong Offerings.

Southern Baptist Convention: Southmont Baptist is affiliated with the SBC. The SBC is comprised of over 40,000 churches across the United States. Southmont partners with those churches to send missionaries around the world, train ministers in seminaries across the country, and other ministries.

What We Believe

God: There is only one true living God. He is the Creator and Sovereign Ruler of the universe. He is all glorious, self-existent, eternal (no beginning and no end) and perfect in every way. God exists in three persons – God the Father, God the Son (Jesus Christ) and God the Holy Spirit making up a triune Godhead. All three members of the Godhead are distinct in their persons but one in essence and co-exist in perfect unity. Each person in the Godhead is fully and completely God. (Deut. 6:4; Isaiah 45:5; Psalm 103:19; Psalm 50:9-15; Acts 17:25; Matt. 28:19; 2 Cor. 13:14; Matt. 3:16-17)

God the Father: He is spirit. He is omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent. He is holy, just, good, and truthful. He is love and full of compassion, grace, and mercy. He is wrathful toward sin and a righteous judge in whom all creation is accountable. He relates to His people as a loving, caring, Father. He is sovereign over all facets of the universe and the One who oversees the eternal plan of redemption. (Jn. 1:18; Jn. 5:18; Jn. 6:46; Acts 2:33; Jn. 4:24; Jer. 32:17; Luke 1:37; 1Jn. 3:20; Heb. 4:13; Ps. 139:7-10; Ex. 34: 6; Ps. 31:5; Luke 18:19; Is. 6:3; Ps. 97:2; 1Jn. 9:8; Jn. 3:36; Rom. 1:18; 1 Deut. 5:7)

God the Son - Jesus Christ: Jesus is the 2nd person of the triune Godhead. He is God who became man when He was miraculously conceived in the womb and born of the Virgin Mary. Since His incarnation, He exists as both God and man in one person without confusion or mixture. While on earth, though He endured many trials and temptations, He lived a life of full obedience to God the Father completely void of sin. He carried out perfectly God's plan of redemption as He became the substitute for sinful humanity by bearing their sin upon Himself and suffering and dying under the wrath of God the Father. With His life and death, He fully satisfied the wrath of God as a payment for the sin of humanity when He was crucified on the cross at Calvary. He was resurrected from the grave 3 days after His crucifixion to live and reign as Lord and Savior forever. After His resurrection, He ascended to heaven's glory and will return to earth to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords forevermore. (Jn 1:1-3; Matt. 7:18; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1Peter 2:22; Rom. 5:19; 1 Tim. 2:5; Rom. 3:23-26; Col. 2:9; Jn 8:57-58; Phil 2:9-11; 1 Cor. 15:3-4; Jn 10:30; Titus 2:13; Rev. 22:13)

God the Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit is the 3rd person of the triune Godhead. He has been at work since the beginning of time sharing in the work of creation, performing miraculous signs and wonders, empowering the preaching of God's people, and inspiring the writing of Scripture. He convicts of sin and the unsaved of their need for salvation in Christ. He also empowers the believer from the moment of salvation. He gives spiritual gifts to the saved for the purpose of serving the church and advancing the kingdom of God throughout the earth. (Gen. 1:2; Jn. 14:26; Jn. 16:7-11; Acts 5:3-4; 1 Cor. 3:16; 1 Cor. 2:10-11; Jn. 3:5-7; Acts 1:8; Acts 1:16; Acts 2:4; 1 Cor. 12:7-11; Acts 4:8; Rom. 8:26; Rom. 8:9-11)

Salvation: All of humanity is sinful and in need of God's forgiveness. All sin is against an infinitely holy God and deserving of an infinitely equal punishment. Therefore, every person stands to be eternally condemned under the wrath of God as judgement for his/her sin. Being a God of love and mercy and grace, God made provision for mankind's sin to be forgiven through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through living a perfect life of obedience, dying in our place, and being resurrected from the grave, Christ absorbed our

punishment, appeased the wrath of God against us, and secured our justification by which our sin is forgiven, and we are made right with God. The atonement of Christ for sin is a universal offering of salvation to any person who puts their faith in Christ and trusts Him as their Lord and Savior. Salvation is based on God's grace alone through faith in Christ alone completely apart from works or anything that can be done by an individual to earn or merit his/her salvation. (Rom. 3:23; Rom. 6:23; Jn 3:16; Rom. 5:8; 2 Cor. 5:21; Eph. 2:8-10; Titus 3:5; Acts 20:21; Rom. 10:9-10,13; 1 Peter 2:24)

The Church: The church is universal and is composed of all those who have put their faith in Christ and received Him as their Lord and Savior. The church is united to Christ through faith in Him and is made up of one body with Christ Himself as the authority and head overall. The universal church is made up of local churches. The local church's ultimate purpose is to glorify God as we worship Him, connect with and care for each other, reach the lost, and grow in our relationship with Christ. Each member of the local church should find a suitable ministry for his/her gifts and employ those gifts in service of the church as well as support the church's life and ministry through generous monetary giving. (Matt. 16:18; Eph 5:25; Eph. 1:22-23; 1 Thes. 1:1; 1 Cor. 1:2; Philemon 1-2; Acts 2:42-47; 1 Cor. 12; Rom. 12:4-8)

Eternity: We were created to exist forever. We will either exist eternally separated from God in Hell or in the presence of God in heaven. Both heaven and hell are places of eternal existence. (Matt. 25:31-46; Rev. 14:9-11; Rev. 20:11-15; Luke 16:19-31; Rev. 21:1-4)

The Bible: The Bible consists of 66 books that make up the Old and New Testaments. The Bible is the infallible word of God and is without error in its originally manuscripts. It was written by human authors all under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. The Bible is God's Word for all peoples, for all places, and for all times. It is the sole source of authority concerning all matters of life, eternity, and salvation. The Bible is the foundational authority of faith and practice for the Church. (2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Pet. 3:16; 1 Tim. 5:18; Jn 17:17; Matt. 5:18)

Baptism and the Lord's Supper: Baptism and the Lord's Supper are the two ordinances of the church. Baptism by immersion is a person's public profession of faith in Jesus Christ and is to be done as soon as possible upon one's profession of faith in Christ for his/her salvation. The Lord's Supper is to be observed in a regular and consistent manner within the church as a celebration and remembrance by all believers of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. (Baptism: Mark 1:5, 10; Acts 8:38-39; Acts 2:41; Acts 8:12; Acts 10:47-48; Rom. 6:3-4; Col. 1:12; Gal. 3:27) (Lord's Supper: 1 Cor. 11:23-30; Matt. 26:26-29; Jn. 6:53-57)

Spiritual Gifts: Spiritual gifts are God-given abilities for service. Every believer has at least one gift, often more than one, but no believer has all the gifts. All the gifts work together and are for the benefit of the entire body of Christ and are to be used for the glory of God, the building up of the church, and the advancement of God's kingdom. (1 Cor. 1:7; 1 Cor. 14:12; Eph. 4:12; 1 Cor. 12:4-26; Rom. 12:3-8)

How can I become a member at Southmont?

1. **By transfer** of your membership from another Baptist church. This is also known as 'by letter'
2. **By profession of faith** in Jesus Christ as Savior, followed by baptism
3. **By baptism** by immersion, after you have professed faith in Jesus Christ as Savior
4. **By statement** of your profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and previous baptism

When can you join?

1. During the invitation/response time of the worship service
2. After the service by talking to a staff member
3. In the church office, any time during business hours
4. By attending "Explore Southmont"

Baptism

Why should I be baptized?

- To follow the example set by Jesus – Mark 1:9
- Because Christ commands it – Matthew 28:19-20

What is the meaning of baptism?

- It illustrates Christ's death and resurrection – 1 Corinthians 15:3-4, Colossians 2:12
- It illustrates my new life as a Christian – 2 Corinthians 5:17, Romans 6:4
 - o Baptism doesn't make you a believer, it shows that you already believe. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Christ does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring, it's the outward symbol of the commitment you made in your heart – Ephesians 2:8-9

Why be baptized by immersion?

- Because Jesus was baptized that way – Matthew 3:16
- Every baptism in the Bible was by immersion – Acts 8:38-39
- The Greek word 'baptize' means 'to immerse or dip under water'

Who should be baptized?

- Every person who has believed in Christ – Acts 2:41, 8:12-13

When should I be baptized?

- As soon as you have believed – Acts 8:35-38

Member Expectations

The big difference between an “attender” and a “member” is commitment. The Bible places great emphasis on the need for the body of Christ to be accountable to one another for spiritual growth.

Expectations of a member at Southmont:

1. Be committed to share in the responsibility of the church...
 - a. By praying for its growth
 - b. By inviting the unchurched to attend
 - c. By being friendly and welcoming to all guests who attend
 - d. By giving regularly, generously, and cheerfully to support the church and its ministries
 - e. By serving in the various ministries of the church according to your gifts and abilities

2. Be committed to sustain the unity of the church...
 - a. By acting in love toward other members
 - b. By being positive about the church
 - c. By being willing to forgive when you have been offended
 - d. By handling any conflict, you have with another member or church leader by:
 - Going directly to that person first and working toward a resolution
 - Meeting with that person along with one or two other church members to help work toward a resolution
 - Meeting with the person along with the pastor or other church leader to work toward a resolution
 - e. By operating within the constitution and by-laws of the church
 - f. By following and supporting the leadership of the church unless that leadership is unbiblical, unethical, immoral, or illegal

3. Be committed to strengthen the testimony of the church...
 - a. By attending the worship services faithfully
 - b. By attending a small group Bible study class on Sunday mornings
 - c. By living a godly life according to the truths and commands of scripture
 - d. By faithfully sharing the gospel with the unsaved
